RADAR - Assess The Situation Part 1 Date:

Description:

RADAR stands for:

R = recognize the risk

A = assess the situation

D = develop a safe solution

A = act safely to fix the problem

R = report and record the upset condition

Contributing Factors:

In this crew talk we discuss the first A in RADAR: Assess the Situation. Talk yourself through what you see and ask "what could go wrong?" The first five questions in the 10 step assessment are:

- 1. Surroundings What challenges am I facing?
- 2. Tools Right one for the job and in good condition?
- 3. Other People Is anyone in the line of fire?
- 4. Breaks Free What happens if this thing lets go?
- 5. Weight Too much, too awkward or unsafe to move alone?

Recommended Preventative Actions:

Make an effort to give RADAR a try.

When you spot an Upset Condition, take the time to STOP and go through the first 5 steps of Assessing the Situation. Think about what you have noticed instead of ignoring like we often do.

You have just improved your chances to control nearly everything around you for this moment.
