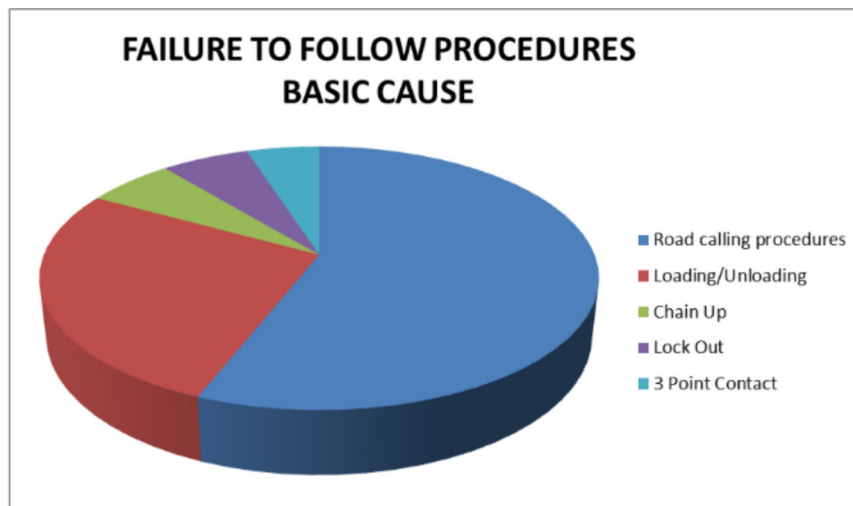

Driving For Safety

FOLLOW ROAD USE AND RADIO CALLING PROCEDURES DRIVE DEFENSIVELY – EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED



2018 TAG Data —Failure to follow procedures

1. Use the **designated road channel** at all times
2. **Call required kilometers** based on the rules of the road for the location
3. **Avoid distractions** (AM/FM radios, cell phones, music players, telematics, passengers)
4. **Restrict radio use** to calling kilometres and short messages. No chatter.
5. **Stay alert** and aware of your location (which kilometer you are at - at all times)
6. When hiring service providers (lowbeds, service trucks, fuel trucks, freight companies for camp supplies etc.,) ensure they have a radio and provide them with:
 - Road calling procedures
 - Radio channel list
 - Known hazards
7. **Don't wait until the last minute**—find a pullout well in advance when clearing traffic

Known Hazards

- Losing track of your location
- Losing track of other vehicles' location
- Vehicles without a radio
- Not following road calling procedures
- Wrong channel
- Unnecessary radio chatter
- Failing to use pull outs
- "Walking over" other calls
- Distraction
- Equipment malfunction
