DESCRIPTION OF EVENT

Property Damage – Power Pole Contact

A loader operator had a rough bundle on his forks and was heading toward the rough lumber storage. The forks were raised but did not obstruct his line of sight.

The operator failed to notice a power pole in the area. When he turned left, the bundle on his forks hit the power pole, and broke the base of the pole.

SUGGESTED ACTIONS

- 1. Conduct a safety crew talk with all lumber yard operators.
- 2. Review the wheel-loader and Lumber Handling SWP including power line safety.
- 3. Place barricades and reflectors around the power poles located in the yard.
- 4. Place reflectors on power lines in the yard.

Most Important Take Away

Identify all power poles and power lines in the mobile equipment operating areas.

Use barricades, line reflectors and/or reflective ribbons to make hazards more visible.
